ייָשָׁרָם explains that in light of שָׁרְעָם s decree that all baby boys born to Jewish mothers be drowned in the river, שַׁקָרָם had separated from his wife (הָבֶבָד Upon seeing that the leader of the generation had separated from his wife, the other men separated from their wives as well. מִרְכָם respectfully pointed out to her father that his decree was harsher than מִרְכָם's decree; whereas מְרָכָם's decree targeted only males, שַׁקִיָם's decree was against the females as well, and whereas מִכְרָט s decree took away life in this world, שֹׁרָע's decree deprived many souls of the opportunity for life in the Next World.

נקרים taught her father עַקרָם something that even he, the leader of the generation, had not realized. עַקרָם thought that if all the baby boys would be thrown into the water, there was no reason to continue bearing children. However, מִרְיָם pointed out that the difficulty of bearing a child, the pain of childbirth, and the agony of watching a child being thrown to its death in the river was all worthwhile for the few precious moments of life that the child would live before being drowned.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{R}}'$ Menachem Zvi Berlin related the following story to $\ensuremath{\mathsf{R}}'$ Zilberstein:

When R' Yosef Cohen — the father of R' Dovid Cohen אָפָינְשָייָא רְאָשׁירָה, the הָבְרוֹן יָשִׁיבָה, of the הָבְרוֹן יִשִׁיבָה, was ill prior to his אָדּוֹלֵי יִשְׁיבָה ו came to visit him, and I asked him to tell me about גְּדּוֹלֵי יִשְׁרָאָל He straightened himself in his bed and said, "Let me tell you a story that happened 80 years ago that shows us the value of even one moment of life.

"The story happened when R' Yehoshua Leib Diskin came with his attendant to visit an elderly relative of his who was very ill. When he entered her room, he was appalled at the conditions in which the woman was living. The stench of bodily waste and filth pervaded the room, and it was obvious that it was forbidden even to say a blessing there. "It turned out that there was a cleaning woman who came once every two weeks to clean the room, but a day or two after she did her work the room would become filthy again, and the situation would deteriorate until the cleaning woman came again two weeks later.

"When R' Yehoshua Leib was ready to leave, the elderly woman asked for a blessing that she should live for many more years. She noticed that R' Yehoshua Leib's attendant was surprised at her request; the expression on his face clearly said, 'What kind of life is it to live like this?'

"She turned to the attendant and said, 'Every two weeks, when the woman comes to wash me and clean the room, I have an hour or two in which I can recite blessings to 'T. After that, the room once again becomes soiled and I cannot recite any blessings. But for the short amount of time that I can make a blessing, it is worthwhile for me to live the entire two weeks in these conditions!""

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When R' Shach came to visit R' Chaim Friedlander, who was very sick, he urged him to take advantage of every moment of life. At that point, R' Chaim's pain was so intense that he could no longer utter even a word. R' Shach sat down next to R' Chaim's bed and pointed outside the window, where trees and flowers were growing, and said, "Look, R' Chaim, at all the beautiful things blossoming in this world that יד created. Strengthen your mind with thoughts of אָמוּנָה about the power of the Creator, about His great wisdom, about His control over all of existence, and about His desire to do good for His creations. Even these flowers we see outside the window were created for the benefit and pleasure of man.

"This is considered taking advantage of every moment of life. If you do this, and you rejoice in your ability to think thoughts of אָמוּנָה, it will be considered as though you utilized these moments as best as you could and you will earn the full reward of these moments."

Dear תַּלָמִיד,

There is no lack of amazing stories that demonstrate the sheer brilliance of R' Yehoshua Yehuda Leib Diskin איז דעייל. For example, he once looked at a tree and told a companion the number of leaves on the tree. When someone questioned the total, he asked the person to tear off a branch without showing it to him. He then looked at the tree and gave the new total, which was the original total minus the number of leaves on the branch.

However, when it came to learning, R' Diskin would put in great effort, and had his difficulties as well.

When R' Diskin was רָב in Lomza, his

day of learning and giving shiurim ended with a nightly study session with a תַּלְמִיד for six hours at a stretch. His חַבְרוּתָא experiences in brief in a מֵכֶּר:

Focuson Middos

"When reaching a difficult point during the nightly learning hours, the **____** would sink deep in thought, standing motionless for a long time, [and] grappling with the questions ... that were overtaking his whole being ... There were times when, even after concentrating so, the answers still evaded him.

"In such an instance, he would ask me to repeat the גְּמָרָא aloud, word by word, while he paced the length and breadth of the room, totally absorbed ... until he would burst into tears. Turning to the wall, he would cry out in prayer, אַנֵנִי די עַנֵנִי די עַנַנִי Your אַדָּקָה.' He would then put אָרָא in a אָרָץ יִשְׂרָאֵל for the poor in פּוּשׁקע י's assistance, in the גַרָּתָ זָרָוּת
